Atlanta City Hall Goes Green For the First Time

There is a special link between Ireland and Atlanta City Hall which brings great meaning to it's greening this year. Fr. Thomas O'Reilly, born in Cavan, saved churches and civic buildings of Atlanta from destruction during the American Civil War, including City Hall.

For many years, his legacy has been celebrated by Atlanta City Hall and the Hibernian Benevolent Society of Atlanta as representative of the bond between Ireland and Atlanta, including a monument to Fr. O'Reilly in the grounds of City Hall.

"Liberators" - Portraits of Irish & American Civil Rights Leaders

Marking St Patrick's Day, Ireland's Ambassador to the United States Dan Mulhall unveiled Liberators, a newly commissioned pair of full-length double portraits by LA-based artist Nikkolas Smith. Presented as a diptych, the paintings feature four iconic individuals – Daniel O'Connell, Frederick Douglass, John Hume and Congressman John Lewis – who forged generational transatlantic partnerships between Ireland and the United States, rooted in the pursuit of abolition and civil rights.

The paintings will hang at the Embassy of Ireland in Washington as a symbol of the long-standing connections between civil rights movements in Ireland and America. The Consulate is also honoured that a copy of the paintings will hang here in Atlanta, the home of civil rights.

CG O'Floinn is pictured here with Nettie Washington Douglass, descendant of Frederick Douglass, at the high school named in his honour in Atlanta.


