Growing Green in Mozambique

In 2019, we teamed up with ideiaLab, a Mozambican entrepreneurship support organization, to launch Climate Launchpad (CLP), the largest global competition for business ideas, which annually showcases national, regional and global innovations, and is also funded by the Government of Ireland.

Mozambique has stood out in the CLP ever since.

In 2019, Susamati placed 3rd in the African final and in the Global Top 16; in 2020, DoCampo Aquaponics and BioMec were among the 10 best African innovations in the regional final, with DoCampo winning the thematic award for Best Green Innovation in the Food Sector and BioMec the thematic award for Best Production System.

BioMec was also selected for the Global Top 16, out of over 3000 competing initiatives from more than 50 countries.

> Organic Aquaponics (DoCampo) Inhambane

A fully organic agribusiness project, based on, continuous research and innovation. It is aimed at vulnerable women and seeks solutions for better nutrition and social development in Inhambane province, through the symbiotic production of fish and vegetables, at a low cost, in a closed environment, in a controlled ecosystem.

> Creating access to low-cost prosthetics through innovation and plastic waste (BioMec) Maputo

Focuses on research to develop prosthetic limbs that enable people to experience life without limitations, reduces costs and production time, improves access and creates better compatibility and comfort for the amputee population, while simultaneously recycling plastic waste from the Indian Ocean.

> Solar Giraffe (Fundação Carlos Morgado) Gaza - Mangunze, Niassa - Malica and Inhambane

Infrastructure that uses renewable energy (photovoltaic panel), allowing communities excluded from the electricity grid to access information, have social and economic interactions (mobile transactions), in addition to providing lighting, distributing internet and broadcasting radio programming. Contributes to inclusion and security in remote and vulnerable communities.

> Mandala gardens in rural schoolyards (Inovagri)

Gaza - Manjacaze/ Manhique

An initiative to demonstrate agricultural systems using sustainable and innovative technologies, bringing together students, teachers and the school community in a rural school, as a tool for theory-practice integration in the learning process, and for climate adaptation and mitigation. It transfers knowledge and techniques of permaculture and agro ecology, valuing biodiversity and natural processes, with the aim of reducing food insecurity, economic and social vulnerability and malnutrition. It reinforces school meals and supplies organic products to the market throughout the year.

> M'artesanato (Karingana wa Karingana) Maputo - Ponta do Ouro

A pilot initiative intended to be replicated along the coastal areas of Mozambique, covering coastal communities in the Maputo National Park area, especially women, creating skills for artisanal textile production using recyclable waste (plastic and fishing nets collected from the sea). It promotes local knowledge and community awareness about the impacts of plastic waste on biodiversity, and creates a platform to spread cultural identity through story sharing. It produces a collection and a catalogue of artisanal pieces created with marine litter, which become an additional source of income for local communities through sales in local markets.

> Yopipila Pemba (ISP/CEPCI/AZUL)

Cabo Delgado - Pemba

A hub for the promotion of innovative businesses, training and preparation for the job market, aimed at young people in Cabo Delgado (including young people displaced from the armed conflict in the province), with a focus on green technologies that increase environmental sustainability. Offers life and business skills training in the areas of bio-construction (e.g. construction with recycled material such as plastic/glass bottles, fishing nets, and available natural resources), renewable energy, and green business start-up kits.

> Viver com Dignidade / Living with Dignity (ADEMO/ United Purpose)

Niassa - Malica/Lichinga

'Living with Dignity' project

Contributes to the improvement of living conditions of the displaced population affected by the armed conflict in Cabo Delgado, living in the Malica resettlement centre, in Niassa province, especially young people, women and girls. It promotes participation in professional training courses (cutting and sewing, carpentry, bricklaying, plumbing and electricity), business management and promotion of small businesses. It promotes the reconstruction of the lives of the internally displaced, serves as occupational therapy, provides income-generating opportunities, as well as the recovery of the dignity of vulnerable populations.
